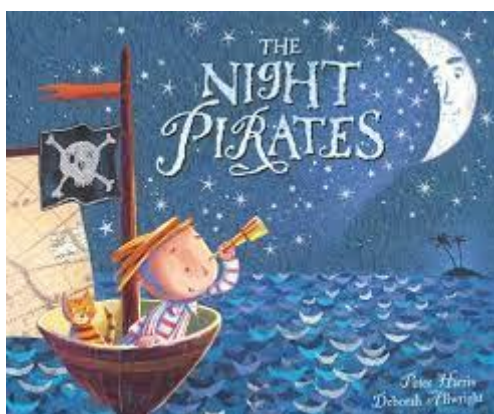


Reception Newsletter- Week beginning: 10.07.23
